## Notes from Fr. Keith 9/20/2009

Have you ever considered how our actions affect others? It's not difficult to see this in action: try doing something unpredictable in traffic. We can't do anything we want on the road anytime because someone might get hurt very quickly and easily.

I saw this in the local paper and the Internet, WHACK the flu:

- W: Wash your hands often;
- H: Home is where you stay when you are sick;
- A: Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth;
- C: Cover your coughs and sneezes;
- K: Keep your distance from people who are coughing or sneezing.

There's a lot of good info out there about how to tell you're coming down with something. Sin is about a free will choice, and nobody chooses to get sick. Practicing a virtue of faith should not endanger anyone else's health or well being: if you're not feeling well, heed the second line above, especially if you think touching someone's hands at the Sign of Peace or shaking my hand after Mass may put us at risk. Jesus probably wasn't ever sick, but I'm sure he understands when we are.
