A Letter From Bishop Gaydos

Dear Friends in Christ,

I have said it more than once in anticipation of World Mission Sunday, but it bears repeating. At Baptism, each of us becomes a missionary, called by our Lord to share our faith with those around us – and to be part of the Church's mission to the world.

It goes back to the Ascension on Mt. Olivet and the last words of Our Lord on earth. Before returning to the Father, Jesus promised His followers the Holy Spirit and charged them with being His “witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth” (Acts 1:8).

That mission is now ours. We are to support, in prayer and sacrifice, the work of missionaries who bring the “Good News” of Jesus to faraway places – to Africa and Asia, to the Pacific Islands and remote regions of Latin America.

Next weekend, on World Mission Sunday, Catholics will unite at Mass and recommit to this Baptismal call to mission. As we pray and respond here at home, the same thing will take place in every parish and chapel all over the world. The gifts of all, ours and theirs, will help the Society for the Propagation of the Faith reach those who await the Good News, who long to experience the hope and love of Jesus.

More than 1,150 local churches in the developing world count on your generous support of World Mission Sunday. May all of us be eager and effective witnesses of Jesus in our homes, in our work, and in our world!
