A message from the Benton County Health Dept.

We want to reassure you that: 1) Most cases of H1N1 flu
are mild or moderate. 2) Patients are expected to fully
recover after a few days of rest. They should rest and
drink plenty of fluids avoiding caffeinated and sports
drinks. 3) If a family member is home sick with H1N1
flu, family members who are well can go to work or
school as usual. 4) Free, safe and effective vaccine is
being made available as quickly as it is received 5) The
plan is for everyone who wants vaccine to receive it but
production and distribution are slower than we would
like. 6) H1N1 flu is **not** prevalent in the population 65
and older. Persons in this age group are more
susceptible to seasonal flu. **Recognizing H1N1 Flu**

Symptoms – Warning Signs for Children are:

a) Troubled or abnormal breathing b) Bluish skin
color c) Lessened intake of water/fluids d) Extended
sleep or lack of interaction e) Irritable f) Fever with rash
g) Flu-like symptoms recede, but return with fever and
worsened cough

Warning Signs for

Adults are: a) Difficulty in breathing or shortness of
breath b) Pain/pressure in chest/abdomen c) Sudden
dizziness d) Confusion e) Severe or persistent vomiting.
Please visit a qualified physician if you suspect H1N1
Flu Symptoms. Avoid self-treatment.

Notes from Fr. Keith Nov. 1, 2009

We've just received some new material about vocations, and it's challenged me to reflect on my vocation as a Missionary of the Precious Blood.

Being a Missionary of the Precious Blood means (to me):

- finding prayer in the midst of distractions
- finding peace in the midst of conflict
- living compassion in a world set on vengeance
- living simply in a society of extravagance
- finding community in the midst of solitude
- feeling warmth and presence when cold and alone
- proclaiming Hope to those in despair
- proclaiming the cleansing power of Blood
- seeing how all who were far off are brought near through the Blood of Christ
- remembering all of the above are works in progress
