**Notes from Fr. Keith 11/15/2009**

“No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.” John 15:13

My grandfather was a Veteran: he was in the Army at the end of World War I, saw the end of that war in the Far East. When my sister and I were little, we used to play dress up with his old uniform, but he was very proud that he was able to serve his country and spent a great deal of time at the VFW and American Legion.

The men and women of our Armed Forces have given their lives for us since 1776, even if that sacrifice is only a few years from the prime of life, a few personal dreams lost while making a larger dream happen. We owe them a lot, probably more than we could ever express.

We took a few moments to remember our veterans this past Wednesday on the anniversary of the end of the Great War, and during this week. Let us give thanks for those who have answered the call for us. And pray for those who are giving their lives for us now, wherever they may be.
