Warning from the 2010 Census Bureau

With the U.S. Census process beginning, the Better Business Bureau (BBB) advises people to be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft. How do you tell the difference from a U.S. Census worker and a con artist?

* If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a Census Bureau canvas bag and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home.

*Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone.

*Remember, no matter what they ask, you really only need to tell them how many people live at your address.

* The Census Bureau will not contact you by e-mail.

Notes from Fr. Keith 11/29/09

“It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you. . .” (John 15:16)

Shopping is one of the basic activities of our society, or at least it seems to be. I don't enjoy it, however with a multitude of choices for almost everything, shopping is something we all have to do. With a free choice, we can value the amount of control seem to have over our lives: our choice, good or bad, is completely ours, and if we don't like what we get, sometimes we can get our money back. If we don't do our homework, our bad choice is our fault, isn't it?

I'm tempted to say that Jesus Christ is the best deal we can get, however that would miss the important point the above quotation makes. Christ chooses us, and we have no control over that. We can try to send back the parts of our faith back, but that doesn't reflect the reality: it's not like we've chosen Christ instead of Buddha, or Mohammed, or Vishu. Christ chooses us, and when we accept that, accept our powerlessness before God, the world and our place in it, then we can begin to make sense of what is real. The world is not a big megamart for us to take advantage of, it is the place we live with each other, and we're stuck with it. We may enjoy shopping, we may enjoy having control over what we choose, but the most important choice we make isn't really one where we can choose something over something else for relatively equal commodities. Our choice to accept Christ's choice of us is the best deal there is.
