Notes from Fr. Keith, 4/25/2010

In the early church, this time after Easter was a time of *mystagogia*: a time where the newly initiated savored the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist they entered and reflected on how their lives were now different. The Church saved in depth explanations of Sacraments for this time, feeling that it was more important to draw on the individual's own new experiences in completing their formation as Christians rather than trying to unpack it before Easter.

As we travel this time after Easter, it's good to reflect on what our Baptism means to us. It's more than fire insurance, it's more than being a member of a special club. Everything we do as Church touches our Baptism. How does that affect how we see ourselves? How we see the people around us in the Catholic Church? How we see the people around us, the people whose stories we hear? How does our Baptism affect what choices we make? After making a public profession, either as an adult convert or as teenager being confirmed, do we really live up the commitment we made in saying Jesus Christ is the center of our lives?
