This weekend, six 2nd graders join us at the Table of the Lord as they receive their First Communion.

One 2nd grader joined us at Cole Camp three weeks ago. It's always rather sweet to see them and their families approach this day with enthusiasm and excitement.

They come to the table with us on an equal footing: we are equally beloved by our Lord Jesus Christ no matter what age we are, and receive Him fully. What does that mean for us as community? How are we to treat these First Communicants as they receive their Second, Third, Fourth Communion? It is said that these children are our future as Church. I don't think that's what has allowed several young people to drift away from the Church in the past few years, I think the question we need to address is how are they part of our present as part of the Body of Christ with equal dignity? How do they feel they are part of the Mission of the Church *now*, so they have a chance to keep that ownership as we all grow in Faith?
