**Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

“No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God.”

Luke 9:51-62

When Elijah calls to Elisha, he hesitated, “Let me kiss my father and mother goodbye.” Elijah does not prevent him. Then Elisha kills the team of oxen he was driving, uses the wood of the plow to build a fire to burn their flesh and distributes it to the people and follows Elijah. He detaches himself from everything he previously depended on. Paul tells us, “For freedom Christ set us free.” Christ teaches us to be free from attachment to things of this world. This freedom is not for selfish pursuits, but “to serve one another in love.” Jesus calls us to follow him, but we sometimes hesitate.

If we start to follow Jesus but let other attachments distract us, we will never be free to discern God's will for us and respond in freedom to God for all that he has given to us. What are the attachments in our life that keep us from the true freedom that allows us to follow Christ, without hesitation? Make a list. Use the back of the page and more sheets, if necessary.

### **Notes from Fr. Keith 6/27/10**

What do we say together at the end of every Mass?

“Thanks be to God.” Many of our also thank me as you leave, but it bothers me a bit even though I appreciate the thought. Here's a paragraph from the Catechism that I've read lately:

“Christians come together in one place for the Eucharistic assembly. At its head is Christ himself, the principal agent of the Eucharist. He is high priest of the New Covenant; it is he himself who presides invisibly over every Eucharistic celebration. It is in representing him that the bishop or priest acting *in the person of Christ the head (in persona Christi capitis)* presides over the assembly, speaks after the readings, receives the offerings, and says the Eucharistic Prayer. All have their own active parts to play in the celebration, each in his own way: readers, those who bring up the offerings, those who give communion, and the whole people whose “Amen” manifests their participation. (CCC #1348)”

If I say or do anything that makes a connection to Christ, it's because of Him. Mass isn't all about me, all of you are part of Mass as well, no matter how big your part is. Mass isn't a performance I supervise for you, it's a performance of all of us that Christ leads, offering us all up to the Father as he offers Himself to us.

So please don't think you need to thank me for Mass. I'm only doing what I'm being called to do; like all of us are trying to do what we're called to do in Christ. We've already thanked the One who is responsible at the end of Mass: “Thanks be to God.”

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
