Cindy Gunter, Pathways Suicide Prevention Coordinator will present the 45-60 minute training that will equip youth and adults to recognize the warning signs and to intervene in such a way as to save a life.

Notes from Fr. Keith 8/22/10

One of my vacation reads this year was a book by Kathleen Norris: Dakota. Some of you may have read one of her other books Cloister Walk. The author lives in small town in the north edge of South Dakota, and since I was going to be passing through the Great Plains more than once, I thought it would be a good preparation for the journey.

It was very helpful, especially in those stretches when I couldn't find a radio station in my car (yes, it did happen). She spoke of finding space in the desert, both in the monastic tradition of the Desert Fathers and in small town life in a tiny town far from anywhere else. Usually we try to fill in all the spaces of our lives, but space is a Sacred quantity. Sometimes we need to focus on creating space, so we can see where life is coming forth in the midst of the emptiness, and so God can have a chance to work on us.

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
