MCC Parish In-Pew Registration Drive At all masses this weekend you will be given an opportunity to put your faith into action by joining the Missouri Catholic Conference Citizens' Network.

The MCC is the official public policy agency for the Catholic Church in Missouri.

The MCC is non partisan. It does not endorse or oppose candidates but focuses on issues and legislation.

Through the years the MCC has had many successes, such as enacting a ban on partial birth abortions, expanding health care to the poor and passing a tough new law regulating triple X pornography stores. But the Conference is only effective if Catholic participate in the MCC Citizens' Network. Participation in the network is free. The MCC only asks that you try to respond to their action alerts by contacting legislators when key votes are pending in the Missouri General Assembly or in Congress.

Through this network Catholics work together to advance the common good by protecting the unborn, assisting the poor and promoting quality education for all school children.

Network members receive regular e-mail updates and alerts on pending issues and legislation. The MCC puts network members in touch with their legislators when key votes are pending. Please consider joining the MCC Citizens' Network this weekend.

October Count This fall our Diocese will again involve itself in a common pastoral practice across the United States known as the 'October Count. Each individual who attends the weekend Eucharist across our Diocese during the month of October will be counted in order to allow for better pastoral planning for the benefit of our parishes and our Diocese. The month of October is selected since it has been statistically proven that it represents the best month for this project.

Sunday, Oct. 3, is Respect Life Sunday and marks the beginning of the month-long Catholic observance of Respect Life Month in the United States. There will be information in the lobby about pro-life issues including the death penalty, abortion and immigration reform.

Notes by Fr. Keith 9/26/10

As we approach the mid term elections, it's important to know where trustworthy sources of information are. The problem with the media is it almost always gets the Church's position wrong in some way: usually by emphasizing the wrong detail, ignoring the history of the Church or by failing to take in the totality of what the Church is saying. We are signing up for the Missouri Catholic Conference this weekend, and their website, www.mocatholic.org, is the place to go for the Church's position on issues that affect us as Missourians.

Shifting through the disinformation of political campaigns is difficult but not impossible. I use websites such as FactCheck.org and Snopes.com to find out the truth of particular claims, and in looking at the news, I use the standard of checking multiple independent sources when evaluating stories. Even using foreign news sources in English is helpful for their unique perspectives and their distance from the biases that affect our national news networks.

Finding the Truth in our culture is always a difficult task. We should not let its difficulty discourage or intimidate us, because if we fail to seek the Truth we are complicit the Evils of our times.
