Today is Right to Life Sunday, the beginning of a Month long focus on the dignity of all human life, which is created by God and precious to God. When we say Right to Life as Catholics, we are talking about upholding human dignity and essential worth of every person from the first moment of conception to the last moment of life. It is about calling for an end to the injustice of abortion and the injustice of the death penalty, and the right of all to a just and honorable education, livelihood and care through stage of life.

We are called to live and bear witness to the fullness of the Gospel at all times; we cannot be tempted to trade away one part of the Gospel to accomplish another part of it. Cardinal Bernadin called Respect for Life a “Seamless Garment” and Pope John Paul II elaborated on this in the encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*. The Right to Life should be the policy of every political party, and as faithful Catholics, I believe we should settle for nothing less if we are to live out our commitment to all Life as precious in God's sight.
