## **Notes by Fr. Keith 10/10/10**

---

The greatest empire the world had ever seen felt threatened by a rapidly growing cult that did not embrace some of its values. From time to time, it tried to exterminate this cult, both through propaganda and by force, but it did not succeed. In the year 395, the Roman Empire officially accepted Christianity as the official religion of the Empire after granting it legal status 80 years earlier. It did not pray for the destruction of the Emperor and nobility that sought to destroy them, they prayed for the well being of them instead. Christianity did not conquer the Empire by force: it converted the Empire.

Political campaigns are about conquest: Political parties seek to defeat their opposition and implement their policies without regard to how their enemies perceive them. As Church, we are not about conquest or competition. We are not seeking to destroy those who disagree with us; we are trying to convert them from enemies into friends so we can move together into a new Creation. The Church has much to teach us about how we should live in a democratic society, and I think we should remember in this key way, in seeking conversion rather than conquest, we are called to be different as we participate in Political processes, we are called to be counter-cultural. In seeking conversion rather than conquest, we live in the World without being of the World.
