Notes from Fr. Keith 10/24/2010

The Christian culture of this country is a “Me and Jesus” culture. The emphasis is on individual salvation, and the unspoken corollary is that beyond religious freedom, my faith is between me and Jesus alone. Being a good and generous person is all right and even encouraged, but superfluous in some ways, because once your salvation is assured everything will be all right.

Many other Christian Churches see the World as fatally flawed and beyond redemption, so working for its benefit is futile.

World Mission Sunday reminds us that our personal faith isn't there just for our benefit. Our faith is to benefit the world in real and tangible ways. Jesus saved us as a people, and he sent his disciples as a group, two by two at least, to proclaim the Kingdom for all. We are part of a universal Church, meant to reach out to those in need around the World, around our Country, around our State and around our Community. The Church itself is a sacrament of Christ for the World, and we are part of the Body of Christ that is the Church. We together are the presence of Christ for the world, so our personal faith isn't just for us alone, but for the sake of everyone. Looking at our faith as something to benefit the world is not only counter-cultural, but essential.
