Notes from Fr. Keith 10/31/2010

The topic of social teaching has been a controversial topic in Christianity since the 19th century. As society moved from being rural and agrarian to urban and industrial, the rapid changes in society presented a great challenge in discerning how to live the Gospel in a radically new environment.

Catholic Social Teaching is one of our least known treasures. It is based on an uncompromising respect for the God given dignity of all human persons at every stage of life. It is not Republican or Democrat, Liberal or Conservative, Capitalist or Socialist; it does not prefer any system over another. It is a comprehensive, Faith based response to promote Societies that live in peace and justice and promote respect and justice for all people.

On November 11, Barbara Ross will be at St. Ann to teach the basics of Catholic Social Teaching, which is an integral part of our faith. I strongly encourage you to come and learn about this part of our Catholic Faith.
