Notes from Fr. Keith 11/07/2010

The Popes have addressed Social Justice for centuries. Beginning in 1591, there were several encyclicals and other documents condemning the institution of slavery and the African Slave trade. Condemnations of abusing native Americans and other indigenous people began in the year 1435 for the Canary Islands, and 1537 for the Americans, particularly condemning the abuse of native peoples under the pretext they were sub-human and were not Christian.

Pope Leo XIII issued his encyclical *Rerum Novarum* in 1891 that extended Catholic teaching into the area of labor in contemporary society. *Quadragesimo Anno* was promulgated by Pius XI in 1931, John XIII wrote *Mater et Magistra* in 1961 (as well as other documents), John Paul II issued *Centisimus Annus* in 1991, and Benedict XVI has contributed to Catholic Social Teaching in his documents *Deus Caritas Est* (2005), and *Caritas in Veritate* (2009). In addition to the main documents, there are many instances where the Church has endeavored to apply the principles of Faith in Christ to all aspects of contemporary life.

This week Barbara Ross comes to instruct us on the basics of Catholic Social Teaching. Please take this advantage to learn more about an integral part of our faith.
