Notes from Fr. Keith, 1/23/2011

Prayer is at the center of our relationship with God, since it is how we contact Him, and Prayer is a prime resource of how we grow in Faith, so it makes sense to spend some time talking about it.

This is a repeat of last year's Prayer series, so there may be a quiz.

There are two kinds of prayer that are probably the most common through history, I would think: the "911" prayer, and the "Santa" prayer. The "911" type prayer is the one we all say when we're in trouble, "Lord get me out of this!." It could also be called the "Foxhole" prayer. We know that God delivers His people, and there are times we need deliverance. The "Santa" type prayer asks God to give us something specific. The song from the musical *Fiddler on the Roof*, "If I Were A Rich Man", is probably a good example of this. We want money, a new job, a special person, etc. and we ask God to give it to us because we're good people and we want it.

The problem is: if these are the main ways we pray, we can get angry with God or doubt God needlessly when we aren't delivered or get what we want. If our prayers aren't answered, we may think that God may have something against us, be punishing us for some sin, or maybe even, God doesn't exist. Here a passage from the Bible can be helpful: "You ask but do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions (James 4:3)". Which means God may not give us what we want, because we're only thinking about what we can get. So perhaps the better course is to ask what Prayer is all about, what expectations do we bring to Prayer, and what should be expect from Prayer.
