A Letter from our Bishop

My Brothers in Christ,

As Catholic Gentlemen, we are called to a life of service. We are called to care for our families, serve our communities and serve our Holy Mother Church. I am excited to share with you that a great and wonderful opportunity exists for Catholic men to answer this call to serve by becoming a member of the Knights of Columbus.

This exemplary Order of Catholic men was founded in 1882 by a simple parish priest who had the vision and foresight to conceive of an organization which would provide Catholic men the opportunity to live their Faith through charitable works, caring for their families, and defending the Catholic Faith. Today, the Knights of Columbus are 1.8 million members strong in 14 countries, and provide a strong moral example in an age where culture promotes secularism over service to others. Last year, this organization of practical Catholic men donated more than \$151 million and 69 million man hours to charity, in addition to providing its members with the opportunity to share a fraternal brotherhood with men of similar values.

We do not understand how this planet works in enough detail.
