## **Notes from Fr. Keith, 2/20/2011**

Creating an atmosphere for prayer is important, as is creating an atmosphere to celebrate the Sacraments. Silence is the most important thing: Silence creates a space for God to fill, and Silence creates a space for us to respond to God. When we enter our worship spaces, we are called into a reverent Silence, we are only to speak and sing together to give thanks and praise to our loving God, and share the Sign of Peace.

There are times when practical issues allow that silence to be broken: to briefly recognize those nearby in hospitality, to admonish a child, to say a helpful word or two when someone can't find their place in a book, to respond to an emergency. Having conversations in the pews contaminates Sacred Silence: it not only takes the speakers away from taking part in liturgy and prayer, it takes those nearby out of their prayer. When you enter the worship space, please do not say anything except to take part in the Eucharist or other prayers, or in extraordinary need. There are other places in our Church buildings for casual conversations.
