Notes from Fr. Keith 3/06/2011

A few years ago, I heard of a visitation on Ash Wednesday where the corpse had ashes on his forehead as his body was available for viewing. It spoke strongly of Catholic identity, but I was puzzled: wasn't it a bit late to be wearing ashes? After all, he was already in Heaven, where sins are washed away forever and ashes don't matter. Ashes are for those who are able and willing to repent.

Ashes aren't a sure sign of being Catholic any more: there are other churches that have started imposing ashes at the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday isn't even a Holy Day of Obligation, although the day of Fast and Abstinence are required. The most important things about Ash Wednesday is a desire to change our hearts, to continue responding to God's love for us through Christ by turning away from things that don't matter in the coming Kingdom, to say "Yes" to God in ways it's been difficult for us to do in the past. It is also about turning more often toward God in prayer and in helping those in need.

It's the ashes we wear on our hearts that matter this week, whether we get to Church or not. These ashes on the heart are a sign of contrition, of commitment, and of faith in a Merciful God who is able to make all things new. They are a sign of sorrow, and also a sign of joyful hope.
