## **Notes from Fr. Keith for 5/1/2011**

This Sunday the Universal Church celebrates the Beatification of Pope John Paul II. This is halfway to Sainthood: another miracle will be needed as well as more investigation before he would be elevated to that status.

Pope John Paul II was a man of amazing faith, tested in persecution and adversity, both as an underground seminarian in Nazi occupied Poland and as a priest and bishop under Communism. His living witness of faith played a role in bringing down the Berlin Wall and the end of the Cold War. For the young generation of Catholics, he was the only Pope they ever knew until his death in 2005. As we celebrate his Beatification on the feast of Divine Mercy, a feast he instituted for the Universal Church, let us remember his example of strong faith and imitate it in our own faith lives.
