Notes from Fr. Keith for 5/22/2011

Do we shape the Church, or does the Church shape us? The answer is one that a theology professor of mine gave, when he said the answer to most of the important questions about faith is "Yes".

We can't help but shape the Church in our own unique way. We are products of our time, and the Church in every age as benefitted from all the strengths of the cultures it has found itself in, while being challenged by every weakness of its times. It seems a lot of voices say we should get what we want out of Church, the Church is primarily here to provide for our well being. Taking this to an extreme would make Church a kind of convenience store, and one could say the problem with the Church today is that it doesn't give people what they want.

However, the Church is to shape us into the Image of Christ. Christ is definitely what the world needs today more than anything else. One could say it's a mold: we pour ourselves into it and what comes out is Jesus. If we worry too much about what the Church can do for us, we may be trying to get out of the mold or even break the mold. If the message of the Gospel doesn't seem to have relevance or power, perhaps we're not letting ourselves be molded enough. Perhaps we're resisting be shaped into the Image of Christ.
