A Letter from Bishop Gaydos

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Pentecost Sunday, June 12, in parishes across our Diocese we will take up a combined collection for the **Catholic Communication Campaign** and **The Catholic University of America** in Washington, D.C. The Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) supports Catholic media projects for the radio, television, Internet, and print in our Diocese and all over the United States. The Catholic University of America (CUA) is the national university of the Catholic Church, founded by the U.S. Bishops and chartered by the Vatican.

Half the proceeds from this collection in our Diocese stay in our Diocese to support our local communication efforts, such as the Taos Sunday radio Mass, **Table Talk** program, the **Mustard Seed** radio scripture discussion programs and the diocesan Website, www.diojeffcity.org. All of the collection proceeds that go to the CUA help provide scholarship support for students, including those from our Diocese.
