Notes from Fr. Keith, 6/26/2011

This Friday, July 1, is the Feast of the Precious Blood. This may ring a bell with you: Precious Blood priests have served here for over 50 years. What is the spirituality of the Precious Blood? Well, there isn't enough room here to spell it out, but I'll try to give you what I can in a paragraph or two.

Precious Blood Spirituality is the recognition that Christ's Blood is what holds the world together. His Blood is in everyone: the innocent, the guilty, the young, the old, the wise, the foolish, etc. His Blood is the family tie of the whole human race, it is the relationship that calls us to treat each other as family. The Blood of Christ gives everyone a basic human dignity that can't be taken away, can't be erased by anything we do. Christ set the example for how we are to live, and brings us near, brings us together through the shedding of his Blood. We are called to be mindful of the price He paid for us in His Blood, and how we are to respond to His Sacrifice with our own lives.

It's basic Christianity: there's nothing novel or unique here, even though it's described in a different way than we usually hear. We don't spread it on top of what we already believe or add it; it's there already. It is living life totally for Christ, and being there for everyone who carries the Blood of Christ.
