Notes from Fr. Keith 7/18/2011

My response is along these lines: almost every American would say one President or another has abused the power of the office, most would say one of the last three definitely has. Does this mean we need to abolish the Presidency, the Constitution or the United States of America? Human institutions aren't perfect, power can always be abused and the Church is no different.

The most important person in the Catholic Church is Jesus Christ. He is here in Word and Sacrament every time we celebrate Mass. The Real Presence is guaranteed to be here, in the Catholic church. Christ can never be compromised, Christ can never betray us, Christ can never lead us wrong. Christ is Justice, and Christ's Justice is inescapable. We human beings and how we abuse power is the opportunity for sin. Whatever happens in our Church and our world, Christ will always be here, and that's why I stay.
