## **Notes from Fr. Keith 7/31/2011**

The whispers have started: the end of Summer is coming. Actually, they've been more than whispers, if you're in contact with any TV commercial, it's full volume. Labor Day is in sight, but it's still six weeks away. We still have quite a bit of summer to go, and there's still time to savor it.

Many folks believe Christianity focuses solely on the Future, the Kingdom to Come. The Future is important, but our Faith is more than that. The journey of Faith isn't just about the destination, but the journey; how we make this trip is almost as important as the goal. The promise of the Future is a freedom for us: we don't have to worry about what's to come, we know Christ wins in the end and we win with Him. That gives us an important freedom: the freedom to live for today.

Today is always the most important day of our lives. Today is the only day we have any effect on, Today is the only day we're fully part of, Today is our chance to live fully. It doesn't matter where we are or how we feel, we live our lives in Today. And living fully in Today is living in faith, for Christ is always with us in Today, Christ is always part of every Today.
