Notes from Fr. Keith 8/7/2011

I had an Old Testament professor who said his greatest priority was to make sure he was on the Right Question. It puzzled me for a moment, since in academic study the Right Answer would seem to be important, but he was speaking of something a little broader in scope.

It's human nature to get stuck on a Wrong Question. There's lots of them of every kind: irrelevant detail questions, questions that take us down tangents, questions that have no good answer, questions that intend to deceive, questions that try to prove us wrong. Wrong questions almost universally try to get us stuck, usually get us stuck between our own ears. The problem with Wrong Questions is the answers never help us, and we can never get to the Right Answer from the Wrong Question.

In my opinion, a Right Question always keeps us balanced, always lets to find a new path, always leads us toward Illumination, Insight, Compassion, Community and especially Christ. One thing I'm always sure of: if I'm on the Right Question, the Right Answer isn't far away.
