This year the Feast of the Assumption falls on a Monday. This means it is not a Day of Obligation this year, due to a ruling from the U. S. Bishops several years ago about certain Holy Days falling on a Saturday or a Monday. Next year it'll be on Wednesday, and will be a Day of Obligation.

It is still a Holy Day, and should be treated as such. We will have Mass at 9:00AM at St. Ann, and it is still a day we should spend time in reflection on God, and the special gift the Blessed Virgin Mary is to us all. Her Assumption into heaven is a pattern we are called to follow, her life is a life we should use as a model, her faith is a faith we should strive to imitate as best we can.
