Notes from Fr. Keith 9/11/2011

I think we all remember where we were 10 years ago on that fateful morning. Waking up to incredible news, a passenger jet crashing into the World Trade Center, an accident surely, until cameras showing the first Twin Tower burning showed another passenger jet crashing into the second tower. The skies were empty for three days afterward; our lives haven't been the same since. Since then, many brave people have given their lives for our country, from police and firefighters on that first 9/11 to soldiers in the Middle East today. We owe them an immense debt of gratitude we should be willing to pay the rest of our lives.

Whatever else we have learned or will learn from the past ten years should be seen through the lens of our Catholic Faith. We do not follow different standards as an America. We must be people of reason, people of courage, and people of heart. Our methods must be consistent with our faith, for we must not give away parts of our faith to feel safe: we risk losing the most important thing in our lives if we do. Healing the wounds of the world is the mission of Christ and his Church. As Christians and Catholics, as those who remember 9/11, we are called to this mission before all others.
