Notes from Fr. Keith, 1/29/2012

"You call him the Dumb Ox; I tell you that the Dumb Ox will bellow so loud that his bellowing will fill the world." -Albert the Great.

St. Thomas Aquinas is one of the most important theologians the Church has ever seen; many will say that he was the greatest. Much of how we understand theology today relies on him, and his influence reached into the spheres of art, liturgy and philosophy as well as theology. Yet for an ordinary person, he can be inscrutable: he was such an intellect, figuring out what he was saying can be a challenge. His classmates didn't understand him much at all and called him "The Dumb Ox".

One of the best books I've ever read is G. K. Chesterton's biography of Aquinas: St. Thomas Aquinas: "The Dumb Ox" I think one of the most profound things Chesterton has to say is Aquinas taught us that Common Sense and Faith CAN go together. At least, this idea keeps us grounded in reality as we seek to understand the sublime. It has helped me.
