Notes from Fr. Keith 5/13/2012

On this Mother's Day weekend, it's good to reflect on Mary and her motherhood. Perhaps the way we picture Her most often is as the Queen of Heaven, pure, regal and serene. However, she was a real, working mother in every way possible.

At the time Gabriel appeared to her, she may have only been fourteen years old. Joseph entertained thoughts of canceling the wedding, which would have put her in dire straits. They made a long journey to a strange place just before Jesus was born, and had to leave quickly as refugees. When they settled in Nazareth, the home life of a working mother was not easy: simple tasks such as hauling water, grinding flour and preparing meals meant hours of backbreaking work six days a week with only the Sabbath off. In many ways, her everyday life was similar to a mother of 100 years ago, only harder. Jesus' adult years brought struggles also, to a day on a lonely hill before a Sunday morning of new life. Yet it was her faith in Christ that kept her strong, carried her through every trial, and brought her at last to her exalted place in Heaven.

As we honor all of our mothers today, whether they are here with us or at the great banquet feast of heaven, let us remember Mary our mother, who is also mother for all of us in a very real sense of the word.
