Diocesan Mission Collection

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Fifteen years ago, I got word that I was to become the Bishop of Jefferson City. Before my August ordination, I met often with Bishop McAuliffe. I remember the pride when he spoke of the commitment of the people to the missions in Peru. I suspected then that he might have received a similar talk from Bishop Marling. I am certain that years from now I will share that same pride with my successor.

Each of us has had a particular challenge. For Bishop Marling it was starting from scratch and finding the priests to pioneer this effort. For Bishop McAuliffe, it was funding the growing work and maintaining it through some dangerous times. For me, it was left to oversee the transition out of our traditional mission parishes. Through all of this, united and stalwart in our commitment, our mission response has developed and deepened.

Next weekend's Diocesan Mission Collection celebrates 50 years of mission. It is an opportunity to appreciate the great sacrifices that have been made to take the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the hungry and forgotten of Peru. It is a chance to be a part of current missionary endeavors as we continue our solidarity with Peru through partners and projects, but also go beyond it as we respond to the call "to the ends of the earth."

It is fitting that we begin this anniversary year with the Eucharist. It is the self-emptying love remembered in the Mass that we in turn must extend to the world. We become the bread broken and the wine poured out for others. This is where mission begins – this is what keeps it going. This is what connects us to our spiritual roots as disciples. This is what makes our mission more than humanitarian, but a zealous and joy-filled witness to the Lord.
