Pastor's Column 8/19/12

I was recently speaking with a High School teacher and we were talking about how students need to be taught behavior that is expected, i.e. common courtesy, respect, kindness, forgiveness, all need to be specifically taught. A teacher setting down classroom rules tell the students what is acceptable and what is not. Regular teaching through word and example constantly reinforces the desired behavior. Sometimes we are mistaken in our belief that the person should just know the proper behavior. An example would be that folks must learn what is appropriate i.e. respectful behavior in church.

The Catholic church has a major body of teachings on how we are to treat our neighbor, i.e. Social Justice teachings. The Church speaks of a preferential option for the poor. Thus, we must be concerned about meeting the needs of those facing the challenges of poverty. If the Church does not speak out loudly enough about what loving our neighbor looks like than the many self-centered voices out there can send a message that is very contrary to the Gospel. Because the Gospel can be very challenging, we must acknowledge that people need to hear a clear message communicating what the love of Christ looks like when it is put into action.
