## **Pastor's Column**

### **New Years Resolution**

It is that time of year that many have or wanted to make a New Year's resolution. Thus, they are focusing on a perceived need that requires a change in their lives.

To help one make a successful resolution, they need to keep it realistic. One factor to keep in mind is that the larger the challenge, the more resources one may need to avail themselves. For example, if a 2 pack a day smoker wants to quit; receiving professional and community assistance may help them in obtaining their goal.

A friend of mine was told by his wife that if he quit smoking he could keep the money he was spending on this expensive addiction in order to buy some toys that he wanted such as a boat, 4-wheeler, etc. He was also able to focus on the health benefits that are intrinsic to being tobacco free.

Some new years resolutions are certainly more challenging than others. One type of change I would like to recommend is simply to pour yourself more into something you are already doing. Specifically I would like to focus on faith. To concretely come up with ways of diving more deeply into what we are already doing i.e. a group or ministry that you are already involved in. For some they feel called to get involved in new activities but for many of us we would be well served to deliberately pour more of our hearts into what we are already doing.

Some might want to consider how to deal with distractions that keep them from being as open to the prayer of the Mass that Christ calls us to. Personally, when I find myself struggling with distractions I attempt to place more focus on being open to the love of Christ so I might be able to feel closer and listen better to Him.

If this doesn't speak to your current situation, you may want to consider these thoughts in preparation for the season of Lent. We are always well served when we look at how we approach one another to our dear Lord with a prayerful spirit.
