Highlights from the Parish Council Meeting

Guest Speaker Sister Kathleen Wegman, Chancellor to the Bishop, came from Jefferson City and gave a presentation on how to better our Parish Council meetings for the betterment of Christ's mission.

Topics of Discussions were: 1) The Church Bells will be rung briefly before each Mass. 2) Criteria, for the St. Ann Scholarships, were discussed. 3) Commissions will meet every other month and Parish Council will meet on alternating months. 4) Commission Reports will be included in Parish Council packets to be reviewed before the Parish Council meetings. 5) Consideration of a parish vehicle to assist families sending their children to Sacred Heart, Sedalia will be discussed. 6) Budgets for the next fiscal year are due at the May meeting. 7) The next Parish Council Meeting will be May 7, at 7:00PM.

Pastor's Column for April 14, 2013

Our newly elected Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis, has certainly made a splash by calling us all to be more aware of the needs of the poor! He has called us to put less attention on the trappings of the church i.e. lacy garments worn by prelates and priests and more focus on the heart of our mission i.e. spreading the love of Christ. The parish councils and I, here at St. Ann & Sts. Peter & Paul will constantly ask the question of, how can we further the mission of Christ by promoting strong vibrant ministries within the parishes.

Even though the Food Bank, WARM House & Cole Camp Food Bank are not part of our parishes, it is reasonable for folks to make a connection with our parish family when they see many of our parishioners reaching out through these wonderful charities.
