**Highlights from Parish Council Meeting** The meeting began with contemplation and prayer.

- Fr. Mike explained the Parish Campaign that will begin in August. This campaign consists of 5 letters to go out to parishioners asking them to evaluate their contributions to our parish. Replacing our church roof took the majority of our savings and required us to take out a loan.
- The numbers have come in for the end of this fiscal year. Contributions are down 20% of anticipated. Expenses are the same.
- The budget for 2013-2014 has increased by \$8,000. There is an employee pay freeze and other cuts have been taken.
- A "Structures and Grounds" meeting is needed to discuss maintenance of our church and priest's home. Volunteers are needed for this committee. Please call the church office or talk to Fr. Mike if interested.

**In light of recent Supreme Court decisions on the Defense of Marriage Act, the director of Communication for the Diocese of Jefferson City, Deacon Dan Joyce has shared the following:** The sharply-divided decisions handed down by the U.S. Supreme Court were not totally unexpected, but are nonetheless deeply disappointing. While the Court's invalidation of the Defense of Marriage Act and its decision to direct a lower court to dismiss the appeal of the California Proposition 8 case doesn't force nationwide acceptance of a new definition of marriage that is counter to the beliefs of Catholics and other faith, we are concerned.

We are pleased that the Supreme Court has decided to limit the impact of the Prop 8 case to California due to that case's unique circumstances. But at the same time, we are dismayed that the Court decided that Congress could not legitimately define marriage in a way that not only comports with our Church's teaching, but in a way that every human society in the entire history of the human race has understood.

We, as the Church, we must uphold the objective, fundamental truth that marriage cannot be anything but a union between one man and one woman with the purpose of procreating and educating the next generation. Affirming the true definition of marriage denies no one their basic rights. On the contrary, protecting marriage affirms the basic rights and equal dignity of women and men and safeguards the basic rights and equal protection of children.

As Catholics, we will continue vigorously but respectfully to uphold the institution of marriage as it has been understood through the ages. We will continue to encourage our federal and state lawmakers to enact legislation, within the scope of these new rulings, that protect and uphold the sacred institution of marriage, as well as the conscience rights we and other religious institutions are entitled to under the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.
