Diocesan Mission Collection Appeal

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Before the conclave, when it was his turn to voice his concerns for the Church, the Archbishop of Buenos Aires quoted Jesus in the Book of Revelation: “I stand at the door and knock.” The man soon to be elected pope suggested that, maybe, instead of trying to get in, Jesus was knocking at the door asking to be let out of our churches to minister to the world.

Next weekend, we will have our annual diocesan mission collection. It is important to note that this theme of evangelization and mission is something that Pope Francis has referred to time and again in his brief papacy. For him, it is the way we answer that knock at the door; it’s what we do as a pilgrim Church that is missionary by its very nature.

The Diocese of Jefferson City is opening the door for Christ when we help maintain parishes for Quechua communities in the Peruvian Andes. We open it when we offer medicines for the poor in Lima; when we provide food to hungry children in Mexico; when we support a new school in Nigeria, or contribute to a new church in India.

As a Bishop, I have been consecrated “not only for a particular diocese, but for the salvation of the whole world.” Our priests, who share in the apostolic ministry, are called to make the promotion of the missions a key element in our pastoral activity. Mission is the work of all who call themselves Christian because, as Pope Benedict wrote, “they are those for whom the Gospel is intended and at the same time they are the missionaries of the Gospel.”

Mission is for everywhere and everyone. It is part of the love by which we are known and part of the hope we offer. Mission is about mercy, justice, and human dignity, but most of all it is about opening the door for Christ to restore the world. He’s still knocking. Will you answer by supporting our diocesan missions next weekend?
